The representatives of Georgian Young Lawyers Association, Transparency International Georgia, Human Rights Education and Monitoring Center will present the Coalition's views on draft changes to the legislation on common courts, High School of Justice, and judicial disciplinary process.

Representatives of the executive, legislative and judicial branches of the government as well as practicing lawyers, journalists, international donor organizations, and experts in the field are expected to attend. The Coalition unites 34 non-governmental organizations including legal professionals, business associations, and media organizations to promote an independent and transparent judiciary by monitoring relevant judicial practices and advocating for reforms.
