






In Human Rights Week, on December 11 GYLA made a presentation of the research-

funded project “Strengthening Rule of Law in Georgia”.

The Research concerns legislative innovations on judiciary issues, legislation and
practice that regulate disciplinary proceedings against judges, including the famous
cases. The work also reviews the issues of maintaining order in courts and publicity of
court sessions as well as the practice of the USA. Furthermore, the research suggests
interesting statistics and data concerning judges and Georgian judiciary system.
